PSC Will Review Savannah Electric Rate Case

Atlanta, November 30, 2004 — The Georgia Public Service Commission (Commission) will begin reviewing the Savannah Electric and Power Company (the Company) request for a rate increase filed today with the Commission. Following three rounds of hearings next year, the Commission will issue a decision on the request in May 2005.

Here are some facts about the Savannah Electric rate case:

- In 2002, the Commission cut the Company's requested rate increase request by nearly two-thirds, reducing consumers' bills by about \$8.00 per month.
- The Commission will hold three rounds of hearings to provide the public and all interested parties an opportunity to present evidence and comment on the Company's request.
- The Commission must balance the opportunity for the Company to earn a reasonable rate of return on its investment against the right of ratepayers to just and reasonable rates.
- The Commission will put the proposed rates on hold for six months, according to Georgia Law, and conduct extensive hearings on the Company's request.
- All interested parties including the public and consumers may comment during these proceedings. Hearings have been tentatively scheduled for March 2-4, March 29-31 and April 26-27, 2004 at the Commission offices in Room 110 at 244 Washington Street, S.W. Atlanta, Georgia.
- After thoroughly reviewing all evidence in the record, the Commission will issue a decision in this rate case at its regular Administrative Session on May 17, 2005.
